

General Regulation Training (GRT)

All individuals working with UNL research and teaching animals are required to have the General Regulation Training completed before they can handle animals. The GRT is good for 5 years and then a refresher course will need to be completed. This GRT can be found online at: www.citiprogram.org. Click on "Register" up at the top to get started. Put in "University of Nebraska- Lincoln" for the organization and continue to steps 2-4 with your personal information. On step 5 you can select "no" for CEU's unless you wish to pay on your own.

When you continue on to Step 7 make sure to select the second box:

Choose all that apply

- Human Subjects Research - required by the IRB
- Animal Care and Use General Regulations Training (GRT) - required by the IACUC
- Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR) - Required if you are paid from NSF, NIH, or USDA NIFA funds
- Conflict of Interest - Required if you are receiving Public Health Service (PHS) funds

* Are you a member of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC)? If yes, you are required to complete the "Essentials for IACUC Members Course"

Indicate whether you conduct surgery for animals.

* If you are conducting studies in laboratory animals, do you conduct Survival Surgery? If you do conduct survival surgery, the module on Aseptic Technique is required. Do you conduct non-survival surgery in non-rodent (e.g., cats, dogs, swine, NHP) animal models.

Choose one answer

- Yes, I conduct EITHER survival surgery in laboratory animals OR non-survival surgery in non-rodent (e.g., cats, dogs, swine, NHP) animal models.
